Considering a story from 6 levels of Bloom's Taxonomy

Describe it (Describe a character in A Wrinkle in Time)

Compare it. (Choose two characters and compare them)

Associate it. (What does "IT" make you think of?)

synthesize it. (Write a set of directions to keep "IT" from controlling your mind)

Apply it. (Choose a partner and create a short skit and act out part of the story.)

Evaluate Judge- tell me which character of these 3 (Mrs. Who, Mrs. Whatsit, Mrs.

Which) is your favorite and explain why.

WRITING STRATEGY USING THE CUBE A writing strategy that prompts students to free write about a given subject or object from various perspectives/points of view.

- 1. Read about the Boston Tea Party
- 2. Write- a quick newspaper article about what happened from the point of view of a character your teacher gives you (Indian blamed for tossing the tea, Patriot who participated in tossing the tea, Tax collector, Ship owner, The King, Tea Merchant)
 - 3. Draw- a picture to go with your news article
 - 4. Listen- (share the articles in groups)
- 5. Discuss- (What are some of the problems these people could face as a result of the Boston Tea Party?)
 - 6. Share- (with the whole class some of your points)
